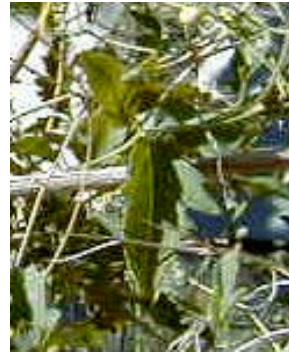


## Chinese Clematis

(*Clematis orientalis*)



Chinese Clematis	
<b>General</b>	Member of the Buttercup Family (Ranunculaceae) Introduced from Eurasia Difficult to distinguish from native clematis when plant is not flowering Has been sold as an ornamental but no longer available in Colorado
<b>Habitat</b>	Perennial woody vine Riparian corridors Rocky slopes near seepage Climbs on fences, trees, etc. Coverage may cause death of tree or brush.
PLANT	
<b>Vegetation</b>	Climbing vine Compound leaves
<b>Roots</b>	Flexible and weak
<b>Flower</b>	From late June to August Yellow bell-shaped flower
<b>Seed</b>	Feathery long-tailed seed heads Silky in appearance
<b>Seedling</b>	Germinates in Spring
<b>Reproduction</b>	By seed
